



"Gratitude Vocabulary Expansion"

Activity Objective: Empower children to better express their feelings of gratitude by expanding their descriptive vocabulary beyond common terms.

Materials Needed:

- Vocabulary cards (can be made from index cards)
- A journal or notebook
- Colorful pens/markers

Instructions for Parents:

1. Introduce the Vocabulary:

- Sit down with your child and present them with vocabulary cards, each containing one of the descriptive words, its definition, and an example sentence.
- Words to include: *Heartened, Exuberant, Enthralled, Radiant, Gleeful, Buoyant, Cherished, Uplifted, Ecstatic, Affectionate* (and any others you'd like to introduce).

2. Discussion Time:

- Pick a word and discuss times when you or your child might have felt that way. Share stories or experiences that relate to each word.

3. Journaling Exercise:

- Encourage your child to pick one word each day and write a journal entry about an experience they had that made them feel that way. They can draw a picture to illustrate their experience too. Also feel free to do a video journal.

4. Word of the Day:

- Set up a "Word of the Day" board in a common area. Each day, pin up one vocabulary word. Encourage the whole family to use that word in sentences throughout the day.

5. Reflection Time:

- At the end of the week, sit with your child and go over their journal entries. Discuss their feelings and experiences, praising them for their efforts in using the new words.

6. Challenge:

- Ask your child if they can come up with synonyms for each word or if they know of other words that can describe positive feelings.

Notes for Parents: The age group 8-11 is a crucial phase where children start understanding abstract concepts better and have the ability to express complex feelings. This activity not only enriches their vocabulary but also fosters a deeper understanding and appreciation of their experiences. It's also a great bonding activity that opens up channels of communication between you and your child.

8. Fortunate

- **Definition:** Having good luck; receiving good unexpected or unforeseen outcomes.
- **Example in a sentence:** "We're so fortunate to have such caring neighbors."

9. Charmed

- **Definition:** Delighted or pleased, often by something small or unexpected.
- **Example in a sentence:** "I was charmed by the little note my daughter left in my lunchbox."

10. Touched

- **Definition:** Moved by a gesture, act, or emotion.

20. Affectionate

- **Definition:** Readily feeling or showing fondness or tenderness.
